Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Explore and manipulate playdough by pressing, squeezing, and rolling.	Use simple tools (rollers, cookie cutters) to create shapes.
Activities: The teacher will provide soft playdough in red, pink, and white, encouraging children to explore texture and movement. Younger toddlers will press, roll, and squish the dough , while older toddlers will use heart-shaped cookie cutters or rolling pins to make simple shapes. The teacher will encourage discussion by asking, " What does the playdough feel like? " " Can you make a heart shape? "

	Dab sponges in paint and press them onto paper.		Stamp hearts in different patterns and colors.	
Activities: The teacher will provide sponge hearts and trays of red and pink paint. Younger toddlers will press the sponge into the paint and onto the paper , exploring the marks they create. Older toddlers are encouraged to make patterns by stamping hearts in rows or colors. The teacher will ask, "What happens when we mix red and white?" to introduce simple color mixing.

	Decorate their card with stickers and scribbles.	Attempt to write or trace their name and decorate with more detail.
Activities: The teacher will provide pre-folded red and pink cardstock for children to create Valentine's Day cards. Younger toddlers will place stickers, scribble with crayons, and glue pre-cut hearts , while older toddlers will trace their names or add drawings to their cards . The teacher will ask, " Who do you want to give your card to? "

	Stick large heart cutouts onto a paper background.	Arrange and glue smaller hearts into patterns or layered designs.
Activities: The teacher will provide a large sheet of construction paper and pre-cut paper hearts in various sizes and colors. Younger toddlers will glue large hearts randomly on the page , while older toddlers will arrange their hearts into patterns or layers before gluing . The teacher will guide a discussion by asking, " Can you find a big heart? Where do you want to place it? "
