Day 1	Topic(s) Theme: Happy Healthy Me! Number: 5 Letter: Hh Color: Pink Shape: Star	Foundation(s) ELA2.2: Demonstrate phonological awareness. ELA1.1: Demonstrate receptive communication.
Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Listen to the "Hh" sound and repeat it.	Identify objects that start with "Hh" when prompted.
Activities: The teacher will introduce the letter Hh sound by saying, " Hh, hh, hh, like Happy and Heart! " Children will listen and repeat the sound. The teacher will then show objects or pictures that begin with "Hh" (e.g., hat, heart, hands, hippo) and encourage toddlers to point to them. Older toddlers will try to say the words while emphasizing the "Hh" sound.

Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Listen to a story with "Hh" words.	Identify "Hh" words when the teacher pauses.
Activities: The teacher will introduce a letter Hh word basket filled with objects that start with Hh (e.g., hat, heart, hippo, hands, house, happy face picture). The teacher will pull each item out one by one and say, "This is a hat! Hh for Hat!" Younger toddlers will observe and listen, while older toddlers will be encouraged to repeat the words. Next, the teacher will play a "What's in the Basket?" guessing game. The teacher will describe an item in the basket and ask, "Can you find something soft that starts with 'Hh'?" (e.g., a heart pillow or stuffed hippo). Toddlers will take turns identifying and holding objects as they repeat the sound.

Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Point to objects starting with "Hh."	Say the words of the objects they find.
Activities: The teacher will play a modified "I Spy" game focused on the letter Hh. The teacher will say, "I spy something that starts with Hh!" and give clues about an object (e.g., "It's something soft we give to show love... it's a HUG!"). Younger toddlers will point to the correct object , while older toddlers will try to say the word aloud .

Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Match pictures of "Hh" objects with identical images.	Match "Hh" words to their corresponding images.
Activities: The teacher will introduce picture cards and word cards with "Hh" words (e.g., hat, heart, hippo). Younger toddlers will match identical pictures by placing them together, while older toddlers will match words to the correct image . The teacher will provide guidance by saying, “Where is the other heart? Let’s match them together!”

	Find the letter "Hh" hidden around the room.	Identify and name the letter when they find it.
Activities: The teacher will hide paper hearts around the room with the letter "Hh" on them. Younger toddlers will search for the hearts and bring them back, while older toddlers will try to say "Hh" each time they find one . The teacher will reinforce learning by asking, "What letter did we find? Hh! Hh for Heart!"
