Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Explore playdough and roll it into small balls.	Create six playdough balls and count them aloud.
Activities: Provide toddlers with playdough in the colors of the week (red, green, black, yellow) and demonstrate how to roll small balls. Younger toddlers will explore the texture and squeeze, roll, and press the playdough, while older toddlers will count out six playdough balls and arrange them in a row. Challenge for Older Toddlers: Guide them to press the playdough into a circle shape and recognize circles as they work.

	Identify large and small circles when shown.	Sort circles by size and color.
Activities: Introduce different-sized circle cutouts in various colors. Show the toddlers how to match circles that look the same. Younger toddlers will point to circles and explore them by touching. Older toddlers will sort the circles by size and color , placing them in the correct groups.

Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Tap a drum or object while following along.	Count out six beats while drumming.
Activities: Provide toddlers with small drums or empty containers to use as drums. Start by tapping six slow beats while counting aloud. Younger toddlers will follow along and mimic the tapping, while older toddlers will count as they tap six beats on their own. Challenge for Older Toddlers: Vary the tempo (fast/slow) and ask them to drum along to different rhythms while still counting to six.

	Use fingers to trace the number 6 with the teacher's help.	Use crayons to trace the number 6 on a worksheet.
Activities: Provide number 6 worksheets and crayons for older toddlers to trace over the number. Younger toddlers will use their fingers to trace a large number 6 printed on paper or a board. Teachers will guide hand movements to help them form the shape. Challenge for Older Toddlers: After tracing, they will try to write the number 6 independently on a blank section of their worksheet.

Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Identify circles in the pizza craft.	Count and arrange six toppings on their pizza.
Activities: Toddlers will assemble a pizza craft using paper circles. Each child will receive a large brown circle (crust), a yellow circle (cheese), and red and green circle cutouts (toppings). Younger toddlers will explore and place circles on their pizza, while older toddlers will count six toppings and glue them on. Challenge for Older Toddlers: Encourage them to cut out their own circles using safe, pre-folded paper and count their toppings aloud.
