Day 1	Topic(s) Theme: Birds & Eggs Discovery Number: 9 Letter: Hh Color: Purple Shape: Rectangle	Foundation(s) ELA2.1 Demonstrate awareness of the alphabet
Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	May scribble or use finger tracing on the letter H outline.	Can trace over the letter Hh with a crayon and decorate it with small objects.
Activity: The teacher will provide a large letter H outline on paper. Toddlers will use crayons, stickers, or finger tracing to decorate the letter. The teacher will say, <i>"This is the letter H! Can you trace it with your finger?"</i> Children will also explore different textures by placing small feathers or pom-poms on their Hh outline to decorate it in a fun and sensory way. Challenge for Older Toddlers: Older toddlers will practice tracing the Hh multiple times and try to verbally say "Hh" while pointing to their letter.

	Can hop in place while listening to the sound "Hh."		Can repeat the "Hh" sound while hopping.	
Activity: The teacher will introduce the letter Hh sound by saying, <i>"Hh is for hop! Let's hop like birds!"</i> Children will hop while saying "Hh, Hh, hop!" The teacher will then call out words and ask, <i>"Does this word start with Hh?"</i> while toddlers jump when they hear "Hh" words like "hat," "hop," and "horse." Challenge for Older Toddlers: Older toddlers will be encouraged to name more "Hh" words and try hopping on one foot to strengthen coordination.

Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	May find hidden eggs with teacher guidance.	Can follow simple directions to search for and collect eggs.
Activity: The teacher will hide plastic eggs around the room and say, <i>"Let's find the eggs! What's inside?"</i> Toddlers will search and collect eggs, and when they open them, they will find a picture of an Hh word (e.g., hat, horse, heart). The teacher will say the word out loud and encourage children to repeat it, emphasizing the Hh sound. Challenge for Older Toddlers: Older toddlers will be encouraged to sort the eggs by color and attempt to name the objects inside.

Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Can listen to different sounds and point to a matching picture.	Can match two words that begin with the same sound.
Activity: The teacher will say two words aloud (one with the Hh sound, one without) and ask, "<i>Which one starts with Hh?</i>" Children will point to the correct picture or hold up their hand when they hear the "Hh" sound. The teacher will also use picture cards of objects that start with "Hh" (hat, horse, hammer) and let toddlers match pairs with the same sound. Challenge for Older Toddlers: Older toddlers will say the "Hh" words out loud and match rhyming words with them (e.g., "hat" - "cat").

	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Can explore letter Hh by touching different textures.	Can attempt to trace or recognize the letter Hh in different materials.
Activity: The teacher will introduce a sensory bin filled with materials that start with Hh (e.g., heart-shaped cutouts, toy horses). Children will explore and say the words aloud as they play. The teacher will also provide letter Hh cutouts for children to trace using their fingers in sand or shaving cream. Challenge for Older Toddlers: Older toddlers will be encouraged to describe how the textures feel and try tracing the letter Hh in different materials (e.g., using a paintbrush in sand).
