Activity: **Lavender Art Bag**

Squirt purple and white washable paint into a sealed ziplock bag and tape it to the floor or tray. Encourage infants to press, pat, and smear the paint inside the bag. Say, “You’re making lavender!” This mess-free art option offers safe sensory exploration and supports early color recognition.

Activity: **Triangle Texture Shapes**

Offer large triangle cutouts in different textured materials (felt, paper, foam). Let infants explore the feel of each and describe as they touch: “This one is soft,” “This triangle crinkles.” Encourage free exploration and compare shapes verbally. This supports early shape recognition and sensory appreciation.

Activity: Shell Shake Bottles

Create musical shakers using small sealed bottles filled with rice and miniature shells. Let infants hold, shake, or watch the movement. Say, “Shake shake!” as they explore the sounds. This activity engages both visual and auditory creativity while promoting rhythm awareness.

Use a mirror and gentle island music to encourage movement. Hold or assist infants while saying phrases like “Let’s dance!” Observe their reactions in the mirror and mimic their motions. This supports body awareness, movement expression, and joyful interaction.
